

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Integrated Watersheds Management Project (IWMP) is a flagship programme of Department of Land Resources (DoLR), Ministry of Rural Development (MRD).
- National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), ISRO has designed and developed Bhuvan Geo-ICT Web
  portal tools namely Srishti and Drishti for monitoring and evaluation of IWMP watersheds. It uses
  high spatial and temporal resolution sensors viz., Carto-1/2(2.5 m), LISS-IV(5.8 m color).
- Current summary report gives details of Project IWMP-67/2011-12, Anantapuramu District of Andhra Pradesh. The total geographical area of the project is **5,514** ha. It comprises of 5 micro watersheds.
- In the project area 139 Drishti photos were uploaded showing check dams/Rock fill dam, livelihood activities, and remaining showing other activities.
- Water bodies have shown an increased by 55 ha, which correspond to the other land use classes that
  have been converted into various water bodies in this period.
- Major percentage i.e. 69 % is covered by the agriculture, 15 is scrubland, 4.9 % is forest and remaining by other land use classes.

# PROJECT: ANANTAPURAMU - IWMP-67/2011-12 DISTRICT: ANANTAPURAMU, STATE: ANDHRA PRADESH

• The study area falls in Vajrakarur Mandal of Anantapuramu district of Andhra Pradesh state. The total geographical area of the project is **5,514** ha. It comprises of 5 micro watersheds. Location Map of the study area is shown in Figure below. Analysis is done for 2011-12 (T0) period (*Batch -1*) projects taking 2019-20 (T5) period satellite images.



- Anantapuram has a semi-arid climate, with hot and dry conditions for most of the year. Summers start in late
  February and peak in May with average high temperatures around the 37 °C range and it reaches around 44 °C to 45
  °C.
- Anantapuram gets pre-monsoon showers starting as early as March, mainly through north-easterly winds blowing in from Kerala. Monsoon arrives in September and lasts until early November with about 250 mm (9.8 in) of precipitation. A dry and mild winter starts in late November and lasts until early February; with little humidity and average temperatures in the 22–23 °C (72–73 °F) range. Total annual rainfall is about 22 in (560 mm).
- Anantapuram district receives moderate to good rainfall from July to October month.





# Natural Color Composite overlaid with Project boundaries and high detail stream network









#### Site Wise Changes in the Project


- Impacts of the activities carried out are presented through combination of Drishti and Srishti captures.




#### Land use and Land cover Changes in the Project

- Captures are also provided wherever changes are observed in satellite images, that may match expected activity related impact, even though they don't have Drishti report yet.
- The result obtained for the period T0 to T5 are given in the change matrix table.
- In matrix table column represents the T0 (2011-12) and row represents the T5 (2019-20)


#### Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2011-12 to 2015-16)




#### Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2015-16 to 2016-17)




#### Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2016-17 to 2017-18)



#### Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2017-18 to 2018-19)




#### Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2018-19 to 2019-20)




#### Land Use and Land Cover changes for Pre and Post treatment dates









- In TO 92 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into Built-up, mining/dump, plantation, scrubland and water body in T1.
- In T1 102 ha of the agriculture area has increased from plantations, forest and scrubland of T0.
- The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T1 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In T1 10.5 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into Built-up, plantation, scrubland and water body in T2.
- In T2 117 ha of the agriculture area has increased from mining/dump, plantations, forest scrubland, and water body of T1. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T2 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In T3 52 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into Built-up, mining/dump, plantations and water body in T4.
- In T4 123 ha of the agriculture area has increased from plantations, forest and scrublandof T3.
- The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T4 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In matrix table diagonal elements represent the both periods in the same class and off diagonal elements represents change in between the classes.
- •In T4 17 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into plantations and water body in T5.
- •In T5 1.19 ha of the agriculture area has increased from scrubland area of T4.
- The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T5 represents seasonal agriculture.

# **Conclusion**

- 1. DPR of the project is uploaded on to Bhuvan Portal.
- 2. The LULC shows that there is an increase in Crop land, Built up area, Reservoir / Tanks & decrease in Scrubland as presented in the change matrix for different years.
- 3. There is an increase of 55 Hectares in Reservoir / Tanks area as compared between baseline LU/LC data 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
- 4. There is an increase of 9.5, 114, 17 & 72 Hectares from T0 to T1, T1-T2, T2 –T3 & T3-T4 respectively and overall increase of 198 Hectares in Crop land area as compared between baseline LU/LC data 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
- 5. There is an increase of 53 ha of the Plantation/Horticulture area has been increased between 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
- 6. There is a decrease of 269 Hectares in Scrubland area as compared between 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
- 7. Farm ponds (20) is visible on IWMP Bhuvan Srishti portal out of Bhuvan Drishti photo of Farm ponds (25) verified from the portal.
