
EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Integrated Watersheds Management Project (IWMP) is a flagship programme of Department of Land Resources (DoLR), Ministry of Rural Development (MRD).
- National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), ISRO has designed and developed Bhuvan Geo-ICT Web portal tools namely – Srishti and Drishti for monitoring and evaluation of IWMP watersheds. It uses high spatial and temporal resolution sensors viz., Carto-1/2 (2.5 m), LISS-IV(5.8 m color).
- Current summary report gives details of Project– IWMP-39/2011-12, Chittoor District of Andhra Pradesh.

 The total geographical area of the project is 6982 ha. It comprises of 10 micro watersheds.
- In the project area 83 Drishti photos were uploaded showing all water harvesting structures of check dams/Rock fill dam, recharge pits etc,.
- Project area as per image analysis has witnessed distinguishable increase in farm ponds, showing new farm ponds or dug out pits and check dams and drainage treatments with 2.11 ha increase in the area.
- Major percentage i.e. 56.4 % is covered by the agriculture, 20 % is covered by Scrub land and 8 % is covered by plantation, 5.2 % is covered by water body and remaining by other land use classes.

PROJECT: CHITTOOR — IWMP-39/2011-12 DISTRICT: CHITTOOR, STATE: ANDHRA PRADESH

• The study area falls in Somala Mandal of Chittoor district of Andhra Pradesh state. The total geographical area of the project is **6982** ha. It comprises of 14 micro watersheds. Location Map of the study area is shown in Figure below. Analysis is done for 2011-12 (T0) period (*Batch -1*) projects taking 2019-20 (T5) period satellite images



- The climate of the district is dry and healthy. Out of 66 mandals in the district, 31 are upland mandals which are located in Madanapalle division and are comparatively cooler than the eastern mandals except Chittoor mandal where the climate is moderate. December and January are the coldest months when the mean maximum temperature will be around 26.40 °C, May is the hottest month with the mean daily maximum temperature rising above 40 °C.
- The district receive 83.62 percent of rainfall during South-West monsoon and North-West monsoon period, the rainfall is nominal in summer. On an average the district receives more than 50 percent of rainfall during North-East monsoon.




Natural Color Composite overlaid with Project boundaries and high detail stream network




MONITORING IN THE PROJECT AREA

Natural Color Composite-2011-12 to 2019-20










Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2011-12 to 2015-16)




Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2015-16 to 2016-17)




Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2016-17 to 2017-18)

Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2018-19 to 2019-20)






Land use and Land cover Changes in the Project

- Captures are also provided wherever changes are observed in satellite images, that may match expected activity related impact, even though they don't have Drishti report yet.
- The result obtained for the period T0 to T5 are given in the change matrix table.
- In matrix table column represents the T0 (2011-12) and row represents the T5 (2019-20)









- In TO 179.93 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into Built-up, mining/dump, plantation, scrubland and water body in T1.
- In T1 125.19 ha of the agriculture area has increased from mining/dump, plantations, forest, scrubland and water body of T0. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T1 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In matrix table diagonal elements represent the both periods in the same class and off diagonal elements represents change in between the classes.
- In T1 57.8 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into plantation, scrubland and water body in T2.
- In T2 8.05 ha of the agriculture area has increased from plantations, forest, scrubland, and water body of T1. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T2 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In T2 71.3 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into Built-up, plantations, scrubland and water body in T3.
- In T3 12.08 ha of the agriculture area has increased from plantations, scrubland and water body of T2.
- The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T3 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In matrix table diagonal elements represent the both periods in the same class and off diagonal elements represents change in between the classes.
- In T3 29 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into Built-up, plantations, scrubland and water body in T4.
- In T4 36 ha of the agriculture area has increased from forest, scrubland and water body of T3.
- The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T4 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In matrix table diagonal elements represent the both periods in the same class and off diagonal elements represents change in between the classes.
- •In T4 21 ha of the agriculture area has decreased and it is converted into Built-up, plantations, scrub land and water body in T5.
- •In T5 57 ha of the agriculture area has increased from plantations, forest, scrubland and water body of T4.
- The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T5 represents seasonal agriculture.

Conclusion

- 1. DPR of the project is uploaded on to Bhuvan Portal.
- 2. The LULC shows that there is an increase in Crop land, Built up area, Reservoir / Tanks & decrease in Scrubland as presented in the change matrix for different years.
- 3. There is an increase of 31 Hectares in Reservoir / Tanks area as compared between baseline LU/LC data 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
- 4. There is an increase of 06 & 36 Hectares From T3 to T4 & T4-T5 respectively, there is a decrease of 54, 50 & 59 Hectares from T0 to T1, T1-T2, T2-T3 and overall decrease of 122 Hectares in Crop land area as compared between baseline LU/LC data 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
- 5. There is an increase of 285 ha of the Plantation/Horticulture area has been increased between 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
- 6. There is a decrease of 208 Hectares in Scrubland area as compared between 2011-12 (T0) & 2019-20 (T5) years.
