

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Integrated Watersheds Management Project (IWMP) is a flagship programme of Department of Land Resources (DoLR), Ministry of Rural Development (MRD).
- National Remote Sensing Centre (NRSC), ISRO has designed and developed Bhuvan Geo-ICT Web portal tools namely Srishti and Drishti for monitoring and evaluation of IWMP watersheds. It uses high spatial and temporal resolution sensors viz., Carto-1/2(2.5 m), LISS-IV(5.8 m color).
- Current summary report gives details of Project IWMP-22/2010-11, Prakasam District of Andhra Pradesh. The total geographical area of the project is 9812.36 ha. It comprises of 13 micro watersheds.
- In the project area 103 Drishti photos were uploaded showing 17 check dams/Checks & plugins, 9 Farm ponds/Percolation tanks, 8 Horticulture, 3 Entry point activities, 1 field bund and 65 others.
- Major percentage i.e. 45.64% is covered by the agriculture, 25.46% is covered by scrub land, 3.01 % is covered by water body and remaining by other land use classes.

## PROJECT: PRAKASAM - IWMP-22/2010-11 DISTRICT: PRAKASAM, STATE: ANDHRA PRADESH

• The study area falls in Tarlupadu Mandal of Prakasam district of Andhra Pradesh state. The total geographical area of the project is 9812.36 ha. It comprises of 13 micro watersheds. Location Map of the study area is shown in Figure below Analysis is done for 2010-11 (T0) period (*Batch -1*) projects taking 2018-19 (T5) period satellite images.



- Project area witnesses tropical wet and dry climate characterized by year round high temperatures. Prakasam has a record of reaching more than 46°C.
- The average annual rainfall of the district is 798.6 mm, monthly rainfall ranges from nil in March to 182.9 mm in October. October is the wettest month of the year. Southwest monsoon contributes significant rainfall in southern part of the district and Northeast monsoon contributes more than 70% of the rainfall.
- December is the coldest month with normal mean maximum temperature of about 27.1°c and mean minimum temperature of 19.2°C. Temperature begins to rise after February. May is the hottest month with mean daily maximum temperature of about 36.1°C and the mean daily minimum temperature of about 27.7°C. During May and early June the maximum temperature rises occasionally to 46°C and with the onset of SW monsoon by about second week of June, temperature begins to drop rapidly.






#### Land use and Land cover Changes in the Project

- Change in land use and land cover form T0 to T5 are analyzed in terms of built up, mining/dump, agriculture, plantation- horticulture, forest, barren rocky waterbody-streams/river/reservoir and waterbody-ponds.
- Captures are also provided wherever changes are observed in satellite images, that may match expected activity related impact, even though they don't have Drishti report yet.
- The result obtained for the period T0 to T5 are given in the change matrix table.
- In matrix table column represents the pre implementation period as T0 (2010-11) and row represents the post implementation period as T5 (2018-19).


## Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2010-11 to 2014-15)



## Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2014-15 to 2015-16)




## Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2015-16 to 2016-17)




## Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2016-17 to 2017-18)







## Comparative assessment of Land Use and Land Cover for Pre and Post IWMP implementation (2017-18 to 2018-19)







- In matrix table diagonal elements represent the both periods in the same class and off diagonal elements represents change in between the classes.
- In T0 526.65 ha of agriculture are decreased and it is converted into built-up, plantation and water body of T1.
- In T1 908.20 ha of agriculture are increased from mining/dump, plantation, forest, scrubland and waterbody of T0. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T1 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In T1 75.48 ha of agriculture are decreased and it is converted into built-up, plantation and water body of T2.
- In T2 659.90 ha of agriculture are increased from mining/dump, plantation, forest, scrubland and water body of T1. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T2 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In T2 92.55 ha of agriculture are decreased and it is converted into built-up and plantation of T3.
- In T3 146.24 ha of agriculture are increased from mining/dump, plantation, forest, scrubland and water body of T2. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T3 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In matrix table diagonal elements represent the both periods in the same class and off diagonal elements represents change in between the classes.
- In T3 47.28 ha of agriculture are decreased and it is converted into built-up, mining/dump, plantation, forest, scrubland and water body of T4.
- In T4 608.44 ha of agriculture are increased from plantation, forest, scrubland and water body of T3. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T4 represents seasonal agriculture.

- In matrix table diagonal elements represent the both periods in the same class and off diagonal elements represents change in between the classes.
- In T4 28.21 ha of agriculture are decreased and it is converted into plantation and water body of T5.
- In T5 18.59 ha of agriculture are increased from plantation and scrubland of T4. The additional agriculture are coming from waterbody in T5 represents seasonal agriculture.

## **Conclusion**

- 1. DPR of the project is uploaded on to Bhuvan Portal.
- 2. The LULC shows that there is an increase in Crop land, Built up area, Reservoir / Tanks & decrease in Scrubland as presented in the change matrix for different years.
- 3. There is an increase of 38.34 Hectares in Reservoir / Tanks area as compared between baseline LU/LC data 2010-11 (T0) & 2018-19 (T5) years.
- 4. There is an increase of 381.55, 584.43, 53.69 & 561.16Hectares From T0 to T1, T1 to T2, T2 to T3 & T3 to T4 and there is an decrease of 9.62 Hectares From T4 to T5. The overall increase of 1571.21 Hectares in Crop land area as compared between baseline LU/LC data 2010-11 (T0) & 2018-19 (T5) years.
- 5. There is an decrease of 106.55 ha of the Plantation/Horticulture area has been increased between 2010-11 (T0) & 2018-19 (T5) years.
- 6. There is a decrease of 1485.32 Hectares in Scrubland area as compared between 2010-11 (T0) & 2018-19 (T5) years.
- 7. Farm ponds (9) is visible on IWMP Bhuvan Srishti portal out of Bhuvan Drishti photo of Farm ponds (9) verified from the portal.
